Astrophysics

Why did you decide to do a placement?

The academic job market is incredibly competitive so I was keen to investigate other disciplines where I could put my skills to use.

Describe a typical day on placement:

Started every day with a morning meeting discussing the overnight markets and information regarding our portfolio holdings. Most days varied quite a bit (which was exciting) and could involve compiling market research, providing assistance modelling financial instruments or attending meetings with prospective clients/meeting with management from companies we had invested in.

What skills and knowledge do you feel you have learned during the placement?

I learned a tremendous amount about economics, politics and the financial markets. Having no real background in these areas made it a tremendously fascinating and demanding learning curve when I first started. In addition to this, working in an environment where teamwork was paramount helped to improve my teamwork, communication and interpersonal skills.
